### Key Volunteer Qualifications:

The most important qualification is a heart to follow Christ and reach the lost. A Key Volunteer should be full of F.A.I.T.H:

- **Faithful** - progressing in the areas of evangelism and discipleship
- **Available** - expect a weekly commitment of two hours. You should also plan to attend other national Student Life events for training.
- **Initiative** - take the initiative to start conversations about God. Help and inspire others to share their faith too.
- **Teachable** - willing to learn and open to feedback
- **Heart for God and people** - Growing in your relationship with God and sharing his compassion for people

## What does a Key Volunteer do?

- Organise a weekly time for prayer and evangelism on campus.
- Share your faith and help others to do the same
- Gather together a team of people to reach the campus by networking with other churches and societies to raise awareness for evangelism on campus.
- Connect regularly with your staff coach

- Grow spiritually as you trust God to reach friends and classmates
- Develop communication skills
- Grow in confidence
- Learn leadership and accountability skills
- Make a difference in the lives of others
